Binoculars Help You "Look"

When we went to Italy several years ago, we took along a pair of Nikon 8x20 premier travel binoculars and had several "wow" moments. In Ravenna, where the Byzantine mosaics are plentiful but far away, our little binocs brought their beauty in close and crisp. In Costa Rica, my Pentax 8x36's stayed on me from dawn to dusk and allowed me to see Mot-mots and howler monkeys close up. Last year in Spain my binocs went everywhere with us and allowed us to see the Lesser Kestrels hawking bugs over San Salvador Church (and lots of pigeons).

After much searching, we have finally found a great entry-level spotting scope - the Vortex Nomad. It has a 20 to 60 power zoom in a lightweight 60mm body. The scope's price is an affordable \$339.99 with its sturdy tripod for \$99.99. Also just in, brand new Pentax 9x32 and 9x42, that are super lightweight and have a nice image with a little more power. I'm not good at holding 10 power still, but these are manageable!

The Los Gatos Birdwatcher is hosting "Los Gatos Birdwatchers" team that will be led by Laurie West-Roberts, long time customer and SCVAS volunteer, on Saturday, April 23, from 7:45-11:45AM. This fourhour field trip will take us to several local hotspots in our quest for approximately 60 species. Since this is a fundraiser for SCVAS and their educational programs, it asks all participants to raise or donate a minimum of \$50. Freddy has been on the SCVAS Education Committee for many years and can attest to importance of SCVAS's Wetlands Discovery Programs that reach over 1,000 school children each year. Valuable prizes such as a birding trip to Panama, optics, time share, and Patagonia gear can be won for raising the most money. • Feeder Cleaning – Drop off your feeders any day of the week. We clean on <u>Mondays</u> and <u>Thursdays</u>, asking only a donation to one of four charities (Wildlife Center of Silicon Valley, Wildlife Education and Rehabilitation Center, Nike Animal Rescue Foundation, and Friends of San Martin Animal Shelter). If possible, please bring your feeders in early in the day. We will call you by closing for pickup.

• Frequent Buyer Program, buy 9 bags 20# or higher of the <u>same</u> seed and get the 10th one free. Coupons do not apply.

• Seed Delivery in the local area, free for over \$40 total, \$4 charge for under \$40 total, available on Tuesdays and Fridays.

• Monthly children's nature programs and children's programs for pre-schools through 3rd grade. Also great for scout troops. For more information, ask for our new "Educational Programs Insiders Info" Sheet. • Outreach to community organizations about birding. We have birding and "Show and Tell" programs ideal for gardening and other service groups.

• Backyard Bird Consulting Program - Freddy will come out and see what

out and see what you have, what you want, and what might work. The consultation is about an hour and the cost is \$20, which will be applied to any

purchase of new feeders, seed, baths, or hardware.

• Birthday parties with Build a Seed Feeder workshop. Bring 11 of your friends to the Los Gatos Birdwatcher (or at your desired location) and build a birdfeeder. Learn about the different birds that are likely to come to the small hopper feeder that you construct from a pre-cut wooden kit.
